

Executive Director's Report

Impact is measured differently across organizations. At Vancouver Firefighter Charities (VFC), we could quantify it through fundraising totals or volunteer hours. But at its core, impact for VFC comes down to one simple question: How many lives did we touch? As demand for our community-based programs reaches an all-time high, Vancouver firefighters continue to go above and beyond—working tirelessly to expand our reach, support as many people as possible, and create meaningful change in our community.

Reflecting on 2024, I am continually humbled and inspired by the sheer magnitude of support our members provided through their incredible work with VFC. Their dedication to improving the lives of vulnerable people in Vancouver is reflected in the **5,000+ hours of off-duty time they collectively dedicated** to delivering our core community programs. These programs—created, funded, and delivered by our members—continue to grow in both size and scope, reaching more people than ever before:

- •Snacks for Kids experienced a major surge in demand, with an additional 23 schools asking for support for 4,000 food insecure children. Snacks For Kids now provides daily nutritional support to over 10,000 food-insecure youth across 93 Vancouver schools.
- Toys for Kids had its most impactful year yet, delivering a record 1,300 gifts to families in Vancouver and contributing \$150,000 in additional support to the Lower Mainland Christmas Bureau.
- Lifelines for Seniors restored independence to multiple seniors recently discharged from the hospital by installing life-saving fall detection equipment in their homes.
- Sports For Kids sent dozens of children to an outdoor education camp, helping to build resilience and self-esteem while investing in the future leaders of our community.

Our programming continues get broad uptake from the community, which is a testament to their effectiveness, but also a reflection of the ongoing challenges our community is facing. As demand continues to grow we increasingly need to direct our collective energy to fundraising to ensure we can meet that need.

Our payroll donation program provides a vital baseline of funding, however we are acutely aware that community support is critical in ensuring that our programming remains effective. In 2024, this was more apparent than ever. Our signature fundraising initiative, Fire in Your Kitchen, continued to elevate its game, delivering premium dining experiences while raising critical funds for VFC. But with demand at an all-time high, we knew we had to expand our reach, share our message, and find new partners to help sustain our programs.

We are incredibly grateful that Vancouver responded. Thanks to the generosity of our community and the hard work of our members, we raised a record \$1.1 million in 2024—the highest amount ever raised in a single calendar year for VFC.

To everyone who stood beside us, believed in our mission, and supported us—thank you.

As an organization run 100% by off-duty firefighters our superpower is our collective drive and determination, which we wield to ensure our programs always have the resources they need. This record fundraising total is not only a testament to the generosity of our community but a reflection of the incredible work of our members, who worked tirelessly to get our message out.

With regard to our members, I want to extend my deepest gratitude to all the men and women of the VFC who are the driving force behind everything we do. Thank you for your energy, passion, and ongoing commitment to helping vulnerable members of our community through our programs and fundraising initiatives. Every one of you is a shining example of the spirit of service that lies at the heart of being a firefighter. It is both a privilege and an honor to serve in my role, and the dedication you all bring to this organization makes my job truly rewarding. Thank you for everything you do.

Looking ahead to 2025, the VFC remains committed to growing our impact, expanding our reach, and ensuring that no one in our community is left behind. Thank you for being part of this journey with us.

The Toys for Kids program reached new heights in 2024, achieving the incredible milestone of \$226,299.64 in toy donations and bringing Christmas joy to countless local children and families in need. Toys For Kids Initiatives

5th Annual BC Lions Toy Drive

On October 20th, 2024 we kicked off our Toys For Kids giving campaign with our 5th annual BC Lions Toy Drive. 30 off-duty Vancouver Firefighters dedicated their time and energy to help raise money and collect toys to help kids in need. The community stepped up and the event raised \$12,000 in cash and toy donations. Thank you to our community partners the BC Lions and London Drugs for helping make this event a success.

Ongoing Support from Local Businesses

We are incredibly grateful for the ongoing generosity and support of London Drugs, Sports Exchange and Sport Chek. Our community partners continue to step up and provide the conduit to much-needed toys and sports equipment that goes directly to children in need throughout the holiday season. Their support ensure that Toys For Kids reach as many families as possible each year.

2nd Annual WRAP DAY

In November, we completed our 2nd annual Wrap Day, where off-duty Vancouver firefighters purchased and delivered 1300 gifts to children in our community. To help identify what families would benefit from this support, Toys For Kids worked directly with the Vancouver School Board (VSB). Thank you to the VSB for their part in helping us bring holiday cheer to kids in Vancouver. A special thank you to the Pan Pacific Hotel for hosting this event and generously feeding all of our volunteers as we worked hard to support as many families in need as possible.

Toy & Donation Drop-Off with London Drugs

On December 4, we teamed up again with London Drugs for our annual drive-thru toy and donation drop-off event. This highly successful event took place at multiple London Drugs locations, where our volunteers collected both toys and financial contributions. Thanks to the overwhelming support from the community we raised close to \$50,000 in just one day!

Pan Pacific Christmas Wish Breakfast

The Pan Pacific Christmas Wish Breakfast, held on December 17, 2024, was an overwhelming success. The event featured a record-breaking cheque presentation of \$226,299.64 and included a festive parade with Santa. Over 150 members and their families came together to celebrate the holiday season and contribute toys for those in need. This year's breakfast saw the highest turnout we've ever experienced, with a line of supporters eager to donate toys and make a difference in the lives of children across our community.

Since 2012 the VFC's Payroll Donation program has been the financial cornerstone of our charity. Through this program, 85% of Vancouver Firefighters generously contribute a portion of every pay cheque to help fund our initiatives. This unified support illustrates our dedication to the community and our shared belief in the VFC's programs and the positive impact they have on vulnerable people.

In 2024, not only did we as a membership dedicate over 5000 hours of our off-duty time supporting our various initiatives, through the Payroll Donation program we collectively donated over \$185,000. Since its inception this program has raised over \$1.2 million, providing critical funds that are instrumental in sustaining our programs, allowing us to make a meaningful impact year after year.

We extend our heartfelt gratitude to all participating members for their continued financial support and generosity on top of the countless hours they have spent volunteering. These contributions are vital to the success of our programs and exemplify the spirit of service that defines the Vancouver Firefighter Charities.



Clothing Donation Bins

Since their arrival in 2020 our clothing bins have helped divert over 2.5 million pounds of clothing from landfills. The 2.5 million pounds of clothing has helped to raise over \$400,000 which has been essential in supporting our charities programs.

In late 2024 your Vancouver Firefighter Charities rolled out new, more secure bins. The new bins are vandal proof and have whisper quiet closing mechanisms. In addition to new bins we will also be adding a few new locations in 2025. Although some of these halls were home to bins previously, we're excited to see them return. The following halls will be receiving new bins: 6, 12, 17 and 20. Once installed, In total we have bins at 11 halls throughout Vancouver. We're looking forward to 2025 and the growth of donation bin program . Additionally, we plan to partner with local schools in September to start an annual clothing drive. Keep an eye out for new and exciting events to further boost the money that the bins generate for our Snacks for Kids program.

Snacks For Kids

Snacks for Kids entered its 12th year of operations, and this year saw a noticeable increase in food insecurity in our community. Inflation and the continual rise in the cost of living has been hitting families hard, and as firefighters in the Vancouver community, we're stepping up to be help combat those hardships. This September saw some of the largest growth in demand our charity has seen to date with the Snacks for Kids program expanding service from 67 to 93 schools. These additional schools brought in roughly 4,000 new kids to our S4K program. We now serve over 10,000 kids with healthy snacks and fresh food deliveries across Vancouver schools.

With the generous support of our community and the tireless effort of our Vancouver Firefighters' membership with fundraising and bringing awareness to this program, we were able to respond to this increased need. I can't understate what an accomplishment meeting this growth is. On behalf of the kids and families who access our snacks, fresh produce, and meals every day, I want to give a heartfelt thank you to those who have contributed to this program.







Snacks For Kids - Current Impact

- Our off-duty members have collectively made 290 school deliveries!
- 215 orders of fresh fruit and vegetables were delivered to 12 of Vancouver's most in need school communities.
- We expanded our support to 93 schools across Vancouver!
- Over 10,000 students are now accessing our healthy snacks.
- The Vancouver School Board selected 'Snacks For Kids' as their charity of choice for their annual 'VSB Gives Back Campaign'.

2024 was also a year of change internally for the Snacks for Kids Program. Eric Himmelman and Will Kuechler concluded their time as program coordinators after years of dedication to growing the program and building strong relationships with community partners to support the swelling challenge of food insecurity in Vancouver. Without their leadership and commitment to our community, Snacks for Kids would not be having the impact it has today.

I want to express a genuine thank you to the hundreds of firefighters who dedicated their time, energy, and payroll donations in support of keeping Snacks For Kids running in 2024. And finally, a massive thank you to all the external donors for their critical support.

While we are proud of the program's impact, these accomplishments are bittersweet as we are acutely aware of the ongoing challenge of food insecurity facing children in Vancouver and how much work still needs to be done. Vancouver Firefighter Charities will not give up the hard work of responding to our community's growing needs




Hall of Flame

Umbrella Day

Umbrella Day has been a date marked on the Vancouver Firefighter Charities calendar since 2016 as one of the VFC's larger fundraisers for Snacks for Kids, Toys for Kids, Sports for Kids and Lifeline for Seniors. Umbrella Day runs in November with the main goal to sell VFC umbrellas to Vancouverites, preparing them for rainy Van City weather. This event also raises awareness for the exciting VFC events to come later that Fall and Winter. This year on November 8th, close to 60 Umbrella Day volunteers with the help of partnered Z95.3 raised upwards of \$24,000. Volunteers sold roughly 300 umbrellas across 5 locations in the downtown core. Umbrella Day is one of many important calendar events the Vancouver Firefighter Charitable will host to support the vulnerable communities of Vancouver, assuring the kids and youth within the Vancouver school board have access to quality food, nurturing a healthy lifestyle for years to come.









Lifelines For Seniors

Lifelines for Seniors began in 2015 with the goal of helping vulnerable seniors in the community by providing them with a device that allows them to feel secure and independent in their own homes. This tool is called a Lifeline. A Lifeline is a small, wearable device that gives its user the ability to call for emergency support at any given time as well as detect a possible medical emergency through fall detection.

Since the program began, Vancouver Firefighter Charities has supported several dozen seniors at any given time. The need for this program was highlighted during the pandemic, where many older adults were frightened to give up their independence and move into assisted living; or visit medical care to address concerns; as these decisions presented specific risks.

Vancouver firefighters have the unique responsibility of taking issues that we see while on duty, and finding a remedy to those issues in the community while off duty through our work with the VFC. Lifelines for Seniors is a byproduct of this process. We would often respond to seniors' home days after an incident occurred and if these patients had a device like a Lifeline, pre-hospital care could have arrived much sooner leading to improved health outcomes and preserving their quality of life.

Additionally we have found that many seniors are hesitant to acquire a Lifeline because of the monthly costs, which is why the VFC also covers all costs associated with coverage.

Through Vancouver Firefighters' contributions via the Payroll Donation Program and Mott Electric's continued support, Vancouver Firefighter Charities has committed another \$60,000 to the VGH and UBC Hospital Foundation to continue this program for five more years. This partnership empowers the Short-Term Assessment and Treatment Centre at UBC Hospital to identify seniors in need and facilitates off-duty firefighters to install Lifeline devices in these older adults' residences.

This year, as we have seen a growth in the program and a rise in seniors who are requesting lifelines, we have worked on developing a closer relationship with the Lifelines company, which has given us additional support and a wider range of products to help support the individual needs of the seniors in our community. We hope to reach more people in need of support this coming year and grow this program.

Vancouver Firefighter Charities is proud of this program's accomplishments but contends with the need for further monetary support due to the growing demand for assistance.

Unfortunately, many factors in our community are making it difficult for seniors to live out their best years. Together, let's enhance the quality of life of our seniors.

McHappy Day

On May 8th, McDonald's hosted their McHappy Day to raise funds for Ronald McDonald House at Children's Hospital. And for the second year in a row, Andy and Jas Bates, owners of many of Vancouver's McDonald's restaurants, generously partnered with Vancouver Firefighter Charities and committed 50% of the proceeds raised from McHappy Day to our charities' Snacks for Kids program, an initiative that combats food insecurity in our city's youth by providing healthy snacks, fruits, and veggies to our local schools. Our off-duty firefighters joined forces with McDonald's staff at 9 locations across Vancouver to help serve customers and raise funds and awareness of our programs and Ronald McDonald House. Together, we raised \$155,382, with the Bates family donating \$77,691 to Vancouver Firefighter Charities! An incredible accomplishment by everyone who helped out that day. We are very grateful for their continued support of our charity and it's programs and for trusting us again with helping with McHappy Day 2024.



Parq Casino Bursary

The bursary award committee was proud to choose Juliette Busch this year. Juliette Busch is a lifelong resident of Vancouver and is a burn survivor from an incident that occurred when she was 5. In response to her experiences, she has been involved in and dedicated to multiple burn support groups and programs throughout her adult life and continues to give back to those impacted by the physical and emotional trauma of living with burn injuries. She is also involved in several other volunteer capacities with the Burn Fund and Burn Camp. As an active contributor and leader in the Vancouver community and as someone committed to the process of becoming a Firefighter with hopes of working for Vancouver one day soon, we were excited to award her the 2024 Parq Vancouver Firefighter Bursary.
